

HOW TO TRAVEL INTO SONORA?

All foreign citizens or residents must get a **FMM Visa** to travel beyond the Border Zone into Mexico, and carry a **Passport** or **Passport Card**.

Free for up to seven days or valid for up to 180 days for \$500 pesos online at www.inm.gob.mx/fmme/publico/en/solicitud.html or at the Migration offices at the border.

TEMPORARY VEHICLE IMPORT

When traveling in Sonora

Hassle Free Zone

Foreign vehicles (cars and trucks only) can transit in the Free Zone without a Permit, except when traveling with Recreational Vehicles in tow: motorcycles, ATV's, jet skis or boats under 15 feet (Only Sonora permit is required)

- A valid **FMM personal visa**
- Valid **license plates**
- Proof of ownership by a foreign citizen or resident
- Driver must be the owner or direct relative, and the owner must always be on board

Only Sonora Zone

Foreign vehicles traveling to the rest of Sonora must get this Permit, valid for up to 180 days with multiple entries

- A valid **FMM personal visa**
- Valid **license plates**
- Proof of foreign citizenship
- Proof of ownership by a foreign citizen or resident
- Driver must be the owner or direct relative, and the owner must always be on board
- Notarized leasing agreement with a letter from the leasing company authorizing the temporary vehicle import.
- Company vehicles must include a letter with evidence of the working relationship of the driver and authorizing entering Mexico.

This permit can include up to three towed Recreational Vehicles registered by the same owner: motorcycle, ATV, jet ski or boat under 15 feet.

No bail required

When traveling to the rest of Mexico

BANJERCITO TEMPORARY IMPORT PERMIT

Same requirements as the Only Sonora permit, plus a Bail issued by Banjercito in Nogales km 21 (Agua Zarca) or online at: www.banjercito.com.mx/registroVehiculos/

CAR MODEL

2000 or older U\$200
2001-2006 U\$300
2007 or newer U\$400

**Upon leaving Mexico and returning to the US, the owner must stop by Banjercito at the border with the vehicle to register the return. Banjercito will reimburse bail the same way it was issued if the vehicle returns before the permit expires.*

Recreational Vehicles (RV's), boats over 15 feet, motorhomes, travel trailers or motorcycles entering on their own into Mexico must get a Temporary Import Permit for up to 10 years.

Cost: U\$51

- Issued for Mexican nationals, foreign citizens or foreign residents (must show proof of citizenship)
- Issued by Banjercito in the border, Mexican Consulate in Phoenix or online at www.gob.mx/banjercito
- The permit can extend for 10 more years if requested 45 days prior to expiration
- Multiple entrees allowed
- Driver must be the owner or direct relative, and the owner must always be on board
- RV's can carry and temporarily import up to 3 accessories registered by the same owner - motorcycle, ATV, jet ski or boat under 15 feet. In this case, the Permit is only for 180 days

** Upon leaving Mexico and returning to the US, the owner must stop by Banjercito at the border with the vehicle to register the return.*
